Stanford In the News

- President Obama presented the National Medal of Science to Stanford's Lucy Shapiro and Sidney Drell on February 1st. The two scientists, one a biologist, the other a physicist, have won what President Obama calls "America's highest honor for invention and discovery."
- Stanford, which has offered admission to 2,210 high school students for the Class of 2017, received a record 38,828 applications from around the world. This represents the largest application pool in Stanford history.
