The book group will meet to discuss *We Are All Completely Beside Ourselves* by Karen Joy Fowler. This book won the Pen-Faulkner Prize (2014). Rosemary, the 22-year-old narrator - lonely, unmoored, and caustically funny - ponders the mutability of memories, the similarities and differences between the minds of humans and chimps, and the treatment of research animals. Fowler slowly and dramatically reveals Fern's (the chimp) and Lowell's (the older brother) heartbreaking yet instructive fates. This meeting will also include a potluck dinner.

**Stanford In the News**

- Stanford Hospital's Department of Emergency Medicine recently introduced a program to provide physicians with meals, housecleaning, and a variety of other services to ease the work-life conflicts for the emergency medicine faculty. The "time-banking" program is part of a two-year, \$250,000 pilot funded primarily by the Sloan Foundation, according to reports. Doctors can "bank" the time they spend doing the often-overlooked work of mentoring, serving on committees, covering others' shifts or deploying in emergencies.
